We are pleased to send you the information regarding the University of Warsaw nomination and student application procedure.

Application Deadlines

First semester (October - February)/ whole academic year - May 15th, 2014

Second semester (February -June) - November 15th, 2014

We should receive the nominations at least two weeks prior to the deadline.

Application Process

All Erasmus+ students are requested to submit the online application at www.mobility.uw.edu.pl<<http://www.mobility.uw.edu.pl/>> . They are then asked to send the application documents (UW Application Form signed by the home university, Transcript of Records and Language Certificate) by post to the following address:

The online application will open on April 1st, 2014.

Language Requirements

Incoming Erasmus+ students are required to have at least a B2 level of English and/or Polish (Common European Framework of Reference: Learning, Teaching, Assessment)

Please note that this rule does not apply to students nominated to study languages. They should have at least a B2 level of the language that they will study at the University of Warsaw.

The offer is being updated on a regular basis.
